The meeting was also attended by approximately 8 members of the community, and representatives from the City of San Diego, Pardee Homes, and Schmidt Design Group, Inc. (SDG).

Introductions and Opening Remarks

Manjeet (Chair) called the meeting to order.

Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes

Meeting minute approval was deferred to next meeting.

Park Visioning Exercise: To Develop Site Program and Amenities Alternatives Glen Schmidt (SDG), led a discussion of potential park amenities. The following key items were discussed:

- Scott presented feedback from a meeting that was held with approximately 10 people at the Airoso community on Sunday Oct. 11, 2015. No formal vote was made regarding the need/desire to create a connection from Airoso to the park, but the general preference was to have no connection. See attached notes that were recorded on the large flip chart.
- JT Barr (SDG) presented a summary of the sports outreach that has been completed to date. To date, phone interviews have been

- completed with 8 sports groups, and 4 additional groups have been contacted. SDG will continue the sports outreach and report back at the next meeting.
- Dan presented an overview of amenities that are planned on the north side of the Loop Road as part of the Town Center development. It was noted that the dog park will be private use, and flexible turf space, children's play area, decomposed granite plaza, and community garden will be open to the public.
- Glen led a discussion of potential park amenities to determine the preferred amenities to be included in each of the three (3) park concept alternatives. Discussion included:
 - Building Alternatives should explore options for different building locations. One option should be locate the building near Town Center Drive to create a "civic" feel. Another option should locate the building farther back close to the access point from the parking lot to create a "campus" feel.
 - o Include a mix of programmed and non-programmed space.
 - o Incorporate activities for all ages in all three designs.
 - o Incorporate a minimum of one active-use field area in all three options.
 - o Explore options for snack shack and for synthetic turf.
 - o Full scale skate park and community garden do not need to be included. Small scale skate elements may be considered.
 - The committee noted that the three alternatives should have a very different feel and intensity of use.
 - o See attached for a draft list of program amenities that were recorded on the large flip chart.

Approval of 3 Preferred Site Program and Amenities Alternatives

The three preferred themes for site program were as follows:

- Program 1: Heavily Programmed/Traditional Recreation
- Program 2: Informal/Alternative Recreation
- Program 3: Passive/Neighborhood Activities (while still accommodating active use)

Ken motioned to approve the preferred site program alternatives and Scott seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

Manjeet opened the floor for non-agenda public comment. All comments from the community were recorded on a large flip chart and are attached to this report.
